



We provide a range of therapy services to the NHS, contracted by the local CCG authorities across the Wessex region.

The contracts enable patients who are medically stable and who have further rehab potential to undergo intensive packages of interdisciplinary rehabilitation at a variety of Hobbs locations, whether they be inpatient units, outpatient clinics or at their home.

In addition, our Specialist Speech and Language Therapy team have delivered services since 2016. The service currently enables us to help people living in the New Forest, Totton & Waterside, Romsey, Hedge End and Bursledon, with their swallowing and communication difficulties caused by neurological conditions. After a GP referral, we see them 1:1 and we offer groups for Parkinson's and people with communication impairments following stroke.



We won the SEHTA award for Partnership with the NHS in 2017, for running this service.

# Hobbs Therapy Services to the NHS

## Covid-19 Support

Aside from our award-winning regular therapy contracts with the NHS, we stepped in to support our local NHS colleagues in April 2020 by providing essential rehabilitation services to help free up NHS beds and facilitate the flow of patients out of hospital.

Hobbs has a contract with Hampshire, Southampton and Isle of Wight Clinical CCG, to provide therapy services to support a number of D2A 'discharge to access beds'. These are within Hampshire County Council nursing home settings or similar environments. Hobbs Rehabilitation is working alongside their existing nursing and care teams to provide therapy input to support the discharge planning supported by Hampshire social workers.

The patients we are treating are medically well enough to go out of hospital, but may have complex care, nursing and rehabilitation needs. These individuals need time for rehabilitation and to assess where they would be best placed to manage their care needs, taking into account their own wishes and those of their family. The depth and breadth of our staff's experience, skill set, commitment to their profession combined with the Hobbs team spirit and can-do attitude is something we are extremely proud of and has meant we were able to contribute to the national effort to fight the pandemic and support our local services and community.
