Rotation Details:

Rotation 1 – Residential/Inpatient Rehab at Oaksey House in Lambourn, the flagship rehabilitation centre of the Injured Jockeys Fund.

The Hobbs team provides intensive residential rehabilitation packages to clients with brain and spinal cord injuries, alongside a small outpatient caseload. Oaksey House provides an active environment for a varied population, including younger clients and sports men and women from the equestrian and RFU (rugby) world.

Rotation 2 – Spinal Cord Injury Service and Hydrotherapy at Hobbs Winchester (Outpatients)

Delivering high quality, holistic rehabilitation to individuals who have sustained a spinal cord injury, both recent injuries and those who have lived with their injury for many years. The role will be based in our Winchester clinic and will include community based visits, including travel to other Hobbs sites and working in the Hydrotherapy pool at Winchester Leisure Centre.

Rotation 3 - Neurological Outpatient service at Hobbs Winchester

Working as an autonomous practitioner in providing comprehensive neurological physiotherapy assessments, treatments and goal setting to a designated and varied caseload of patients with neurological dysfunction as part of the outpatient team and intensive IDT outpatient team. The role is based at Winchester but includes covering other Hobbs sites when required and community visits.
